Prior to joining Kozyak Tropin & Throckmorton, Daniel was a litigator at Cadwalader, Wickersham & Taft LLP, Wall Street's oldest law firm, where he had the privilege of representing President Obama's Task Force on the Auto Industry in its handling of the financial bailout of Chrysler and General Motors. He later served as a judicial law clerk to the Honorable Cathy L. Waldor, United States Magistrate Judge for the District of New Jersey in 2014-2015, and subsequently practiced at Norton Rose Fulbright US LLP in New York prior to moving back home to Miami.

Daniel has been engaged in civil rights pro bono matters his entire career. Notably, Daniel successfully litigated for and obtained the immediate release of a detained asylum seeker facing certain death in his home country and has been recognized by the Legal Aid Society of New York for his assistance representing foreign-born victims of domestic violence in obtaining permanent residence status. In a recent pro bono civil rights matter in federal court, Daniel and his team obtained a substantial monetary award for an individual who was a victim of police brutality and asserted claims under Section 1983.
